Durham SENDIASS have devised a guide to help parents, carers and young people (16-25) to continue to access the service during the COVID-19 Outbreak.

Our primary aim is to ensure that we can maintain service delivery in County Durham whilst keeping everyone safe and well.

We are moving all our available resources to a telephone, email and website service delivery model.

We have decided to suspend all face to face contact. This means that we are suspending face to face contact with families and also attending meetings.

We will only allow face to face appointments (at service coordinator's discretion) where it is absolutely critical that advice cannot be delivered over the phone, by email and where resources allow.

- The SENDIASS helpline (0191 5873541) continues to be operational. Please telephone as normal. If the phoneline is busy, please leave a voicemail on the answer machine. The answer machine will be check each day and calls returned promptly.
