Forest School

Forest School is a great opportunity for children to work outdoors and develop skills of team work, resilience, exploration and confidence. On Tuesday, our Y6 class had a great afternoon using cutting tools, orienteering and of course toasting marshmallows!

Attendance

Just a reminder if your child is ill please either call the office or you can send an email. NHS guidance was sent out via email earlier in the week for absence periods for different illnesses. If you are not sure contact the school office.

If a child is not in school after 9.15am and we have had no contact it will be recorded as unauthorised. Also any lates after 9.15am are recorded as unauthorised for the morning session.

We encourage holidays not to be taken during term time. Children miss lots of learning and also miss out on so many opportunities. If a child misses 10days for a 2 week holiday their attendance would be equate to less than 95% for the academic year and that would be without any further periods of absence. The National Expectation for attendance is 96% and as a school we have to try our best to achieve that mark.

Further details about keeping you informed of your child's attendance will be sent out next week.

For any holidays, a Leave of Absence form must be filled out. This can be found on our website or you can contact our office. Please note that for holidays longer than 5 days absence, a referral will be made to Durham County Council and a fixed penalty notice will be incurred for both parents.
