What will the children be doing?

What equipment is needed?

Old clothes are best, with some spares just in case! Please remember that there's a good chance of stuff getting wet, muddy or stepped on! It's definitely worth making sure that everything has their name in it to reduce lost-property at the end of the camp.

Kit list

- Waterproof jacket
- Sleeping bag (3 season if possible)
- Pyjamas or onesie
- Medication (Must be handed in to school office and medication form signed)
- Wash kit - soap, toothbrush, toothpaste etc.
- Towel and hairbrush
- Torch and batteries
- Warm socks
- Warm hat
- T-shirts
- Warm jumpers or fleeces
- Trousers - preferably not jeans
- Shorts
- Trainers
- Wellies
- A couple of bin liners for all those smelly socks! Optional
- Blanket
- Pillow
- Teddy
- Drinking bottle

Safety
