

Golden Time

- Behaviour is an area of learning just like learning to read and it is our job to support the children to make good decisions as well as modelling positive behaviour and attitudes.
- We are very proud of the behaviour in our school and all staff work hard to support pupils so that we have a safe, respectful environment.
- Good behaviour during the week leads to children earning their golden time for the week.
- If the children earn their golden time each week this will lead to a Golden Day at the end of each half term.
- If the children are unable to follow the classroom or school rules it could result in a lost playtime which means that they don't earn their golden time for that week.
- We support pupils to earn golden time. Children are still able to earn enough golden time with future positive behaviour.

- ➤ Your child should bring their school bag (provided by school) every day which will have their reading books and planner inside.




Walking Home/Collection

Homework - Spellings and Maths Facts

- ► 20 spellings
- ▶ 20 maths facts
- ► Spellings and maths facts to be learnt for the test on a Monday they are recorded towards the back of your child's planner.
- ► Children record their scores on page 12 of their planner. Please initial the score once you have seen it.





Homework - Reading

- ► Daily reading 30 minutes at least 5 times a week Merit mark awarded for 5 sessions of reading.
- ▶ Please record reading in your child's planner.
- Please sign your child's planner at the end of the week.
- Reading books will be changed weekly or when the child has finished their book.
- ► Children are heard reading individually within school each week by different members of staff.
- Your support with reading makes a HUGE difference.
- ► We will support children who cannot read at home by listening to them in school.




Extra Learning Time

- ▶ If your child is not completing or are unable to complete their reading at home, they will be supported in school to catch up with their reading.
- ► Planners will be checked on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday.
- Extra learning time is a time for children who are scoring a total of 3 or more spellings and/or maths facts incorrectly to have extra practise.
- Extra learning time takes place on a Tuesday in our school library.



Booster Groups

- Multiple staff work with Year Six children over the course of the year during the day and after school.
- Extra support/group sessions will take place during the school day as well as after school. These sessions are a great opportunity for your child to further their learning and build their confidence.
